Joshua's Farewell Address

Joshua 24:1-33

A great leader gives his final speech.

- Note how many times in chapter 24 the name “**LORD**” is used. Joshua, in his final speech, directed their minds on Jehovah, the God of Israel. If you had one speech left to give, what would you say?
- Who is gathered for this speech? Where are they gathered? (24:1)
- What was Abraham's father and family doing when God called him to “get out” (24:2; Gen. 12:1).
- Why is Joshua giving them a history lesson? What history is he bringing up in these verses? (24:2-13)
- “***But as for me and my house***” — The classic statement of Joshua! What grave choice does Joshua place before the people? (24:14-15)
- How did the people respond? (24:16-18)
- What did Joshua mean when he told them “You cannot serve the Lord”? (24:19-20)
- What did Joshua set up as a “witness” of the covenant Israel made to serve the Lord? (24:21-28)
- Give Joshua's age when he died. Where was he buried? (24:29-30)

- For how long did Israel serve the Lord? (24:31; Judges 2:6-10)

- The bones of Joseph—Where were they buried? (24:32; Genesis 33:19; 48:22; 50:25; Heb. 11:22)

- Where was Eleazar, son of Aaron, buried? (24:33)
